This year, the College has 167 graduates, of which 84 attended the ceremony at the Armoury House of the Honourable Artillery Company in

London. Graduates come from different countries, most of them being German or British. They are all part-time students, taking their courses while working for companies like Siemens, Bosch, Commerzbank, Obi, Volkswagen or Deutsche Bank. All courses are taught in English.

Mr Quelle congratulated the graduates, highlighting that in a knowledge-based society, education, training and lifelong learning are the most important ingredients for successful employment and social integration, and that international experience is essential for doing international business. He pointed out that it is a worthwhile challenge for everyone to be exposed to a different culture and to find out how he or she can benefit from the experience. Mr Quelle paid tribute to the Bologna Process which has achieved the mutual recognition of a wide range of qualifications, facilitating international mobility with the aim of creating a European Higher Education Area.
